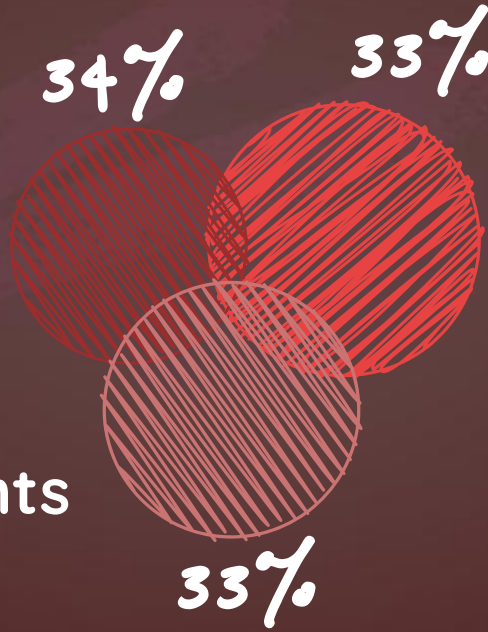

- Consents and Permissions: Parents/Guardians are required to fill out this online form for all New students to Hunterdon Central by August 31st and returning students if any changes need to be made. Click here, select the Student Name using the mapping tool, select OK, select Next to complete the form.
- Consent to Random Drug and Alcohol Testing: All students wishing to participate in on-campus parking, the voluntary drug testing program, any extracurricular activity, athletic program and the student's activities (parent/guardian must consent to allow drug and alcohol testing pursuant to the HCRSD Random Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy. - ASPEN login will be emailed home. BE SURE TO SAVE THIS INFORMATION  
You will need it for all four years!
- Scheduling instructions available online.
- Review course recommendations that are already listed
- Enter elective courses directly into ASPEN
- Use exact course numbers
- INCLUDE at least 2 ALTERNATES

# Teacher Recommendations

- CONCERNS about your recommended placement?  
Speak with your teachers, parents, and counselor
- Parents can waive a recommendation but **PLEASE THINK CAREFULLY** about what is right for you.
- If you waive to move up a level and are struggling, **YOU MAY NOT BE ABLE TO MOVE BACK DOWN.** Level changes depend on the number of open seats
- If you are recommended for multiple honors courses, you do not have to take all of them. Think about the balance that is right for you.



# Tech Tools/Freshman Study Hall

#609 - TECH TOOLS & ORGANIZATIONAL SKILLS/FRESHMAN STUDY - 1.25 CREDITS Grades: 9

This course will help students develop an understanding of their personal learning styles and explore study skills and work habits that work with their learning style. Students will also explore various technology tools that can be used to help organize tasks and manage their workload. Personal organization skills are essential for success in high school, college and careers. In addition to skill development, students will have the opportunity to complete assignments for current courses in a supervised environment.

- Should we register for a study hall?
  - This depends on overall balance of academics and activities, student's study habits, recommendation from teachers.

  - Freshman tech tools and organization/ study hall #609 ( *\*Only available during 9th Grade*)

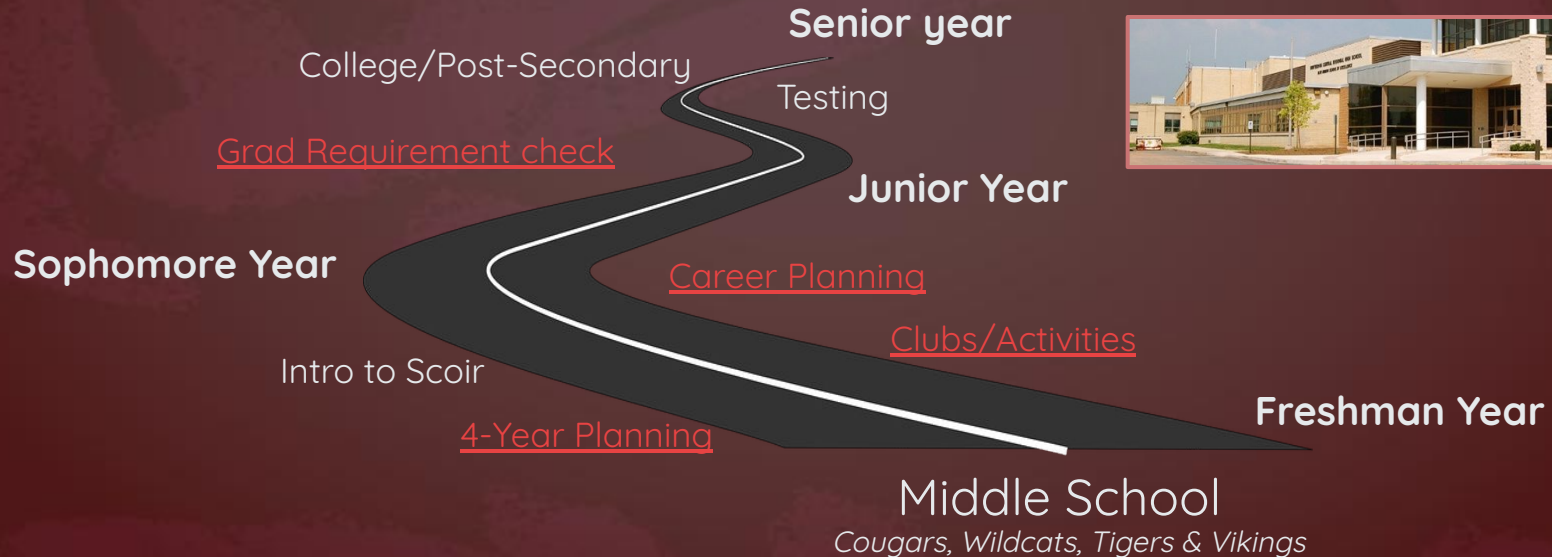
